



## **Protecting Your Home**

Making your home safer from crime doesn't mean having to install expensive equipment.

- Make sure all doors are sturdy, use deadbolt locks, install a peep hole, and properly secure all windows and sliding glass doors (no matter what floor you live on).
- Always lock your doors.
- Follow the 2x6 rule. Shrubbery no higher than 2 feet tall, canopy/awnings no lower than 6 feet tall.
- Put away tools, ladders, and any other machinery when not in use.
- Keep jewelry and other valuables in a safe located in a creative space in your home.
- Get to know your neighbors and implement a neighborhood watch.
- Never allow strangers into your home! Unless you have requested their presence (e.g. repair man).
- Keep an eye out for your neighbors and ask them to do the same for you. A nosey neighbor is a good neighbor.
- Take pride in your neighborhood!
- Call the police to immediately report suspicious people or activity. You and even remain anonymous.

# **Personal Safety**

Protect yourself from harm by using awareness, preparedness, and the use of strategies to avoid dangerous situations.

- Be alert, vigilant, and aware of your surroundings at all times.
- Carry only what is absolutely necessary in your purse or wallet.
- Carry a cell phone, but don't be distracted.
- Avoid walking alone at night. Try having a friend walk with you.
- Walk alertly and assertively through a parking lot or down the street.
- If you think someone is following you, switch directions, cross the street or run and scream or help.
- Have your car/house key in hand before you reach the door.
- Try to use ATM's during daylight hours. Have your card in hand, but don't approach the ATM if you're uneasy about suspicious cars or people nearby.
- If you're the victim of an armed robbery, remember that your LIFE is worth more than your property.

#### **Vehicle Security**

Protect your vehicle from theft, unauthorized access, or damage by using alarm systems, immobilizers, and advanced tracking devices.

- Lock all vehicle doors and put windows up when you park.
- Do not leave any items of value in your vehicle (e.g. laptops, cameras, money, purses/wallets, guns/weapons, etc.)
- Park in well-lit areas, close to sidewalks, stores, and people.
- Never leave your car running or the keys in the ignition when you're away from it. Even for just a minute.
- Approach your car with the key in hand, looking around and inside the car before getting in.
- Be especially alert at intersections, gas stations, ATMs, shopping malls, convenience and grocery stores.
- Avoid hiding a spare key in the car.
- If you have an older car, use a steering wheel lock.
